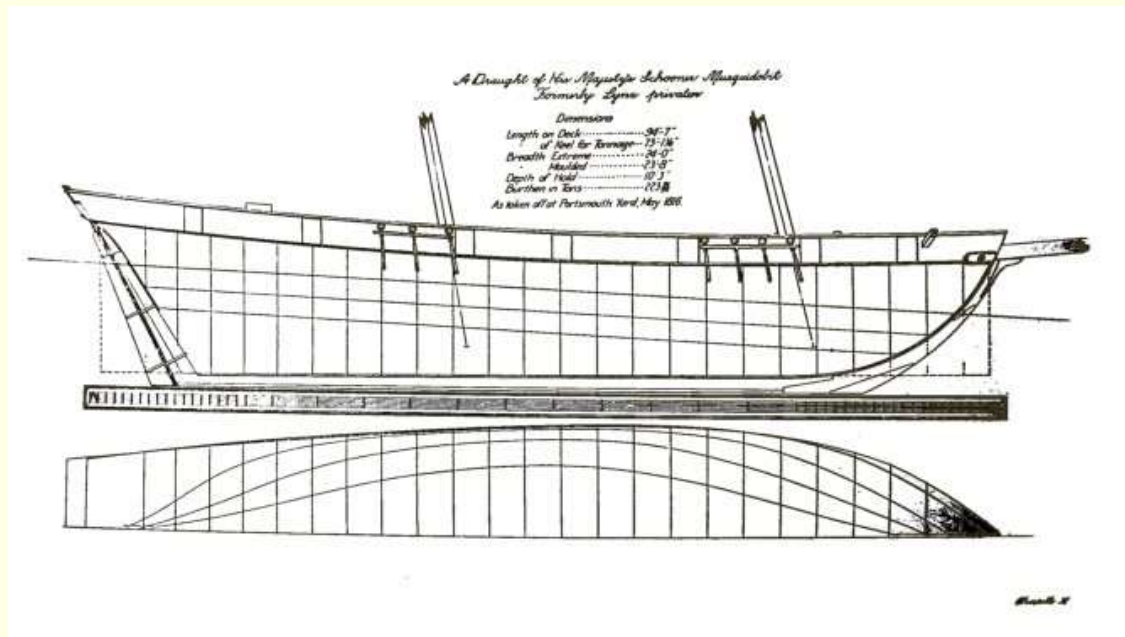
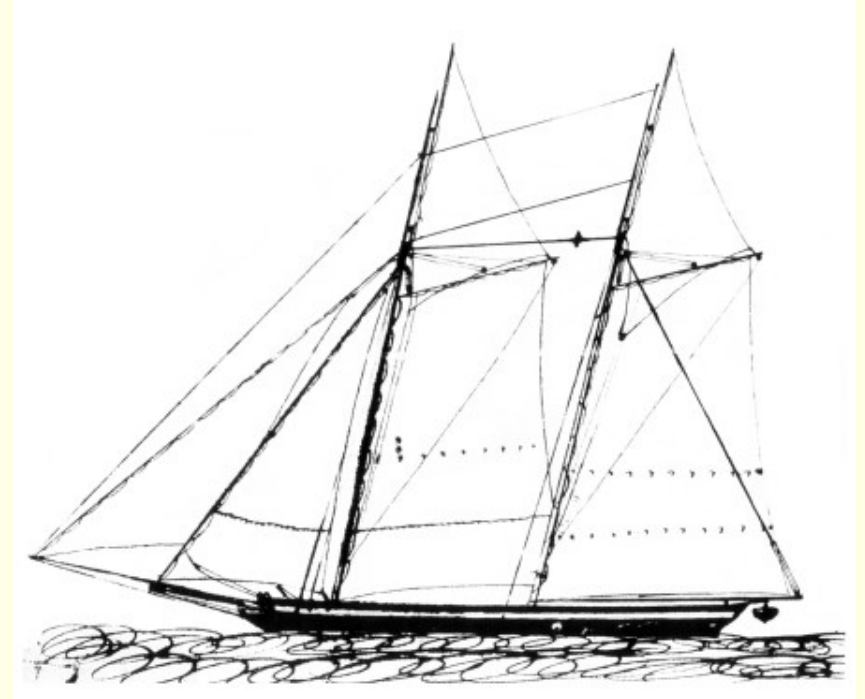

Baltimore Pilot Schooner *Arrow*

- Baltimore Pilot Schooner
- Built 1811
- Built at Fell's Point, Baltimore,
by Thomas & Joseph Kemp
- Keel length 71ft (22m)
- Designed for speed and manoeuvrability
- With a 'sharp hull and extremely long spars'





From *Arrow* to HMS *Whiting*



- May 1812 - Bordeaux for Baltimore
- Captured by HMS *Andromache* (38 guns)
- Sent to Plymouth with a prize crew
- Taken up by the Royal Navy as HMS *Whiting*

the Capt of the Majesty's late Schooner Whiting

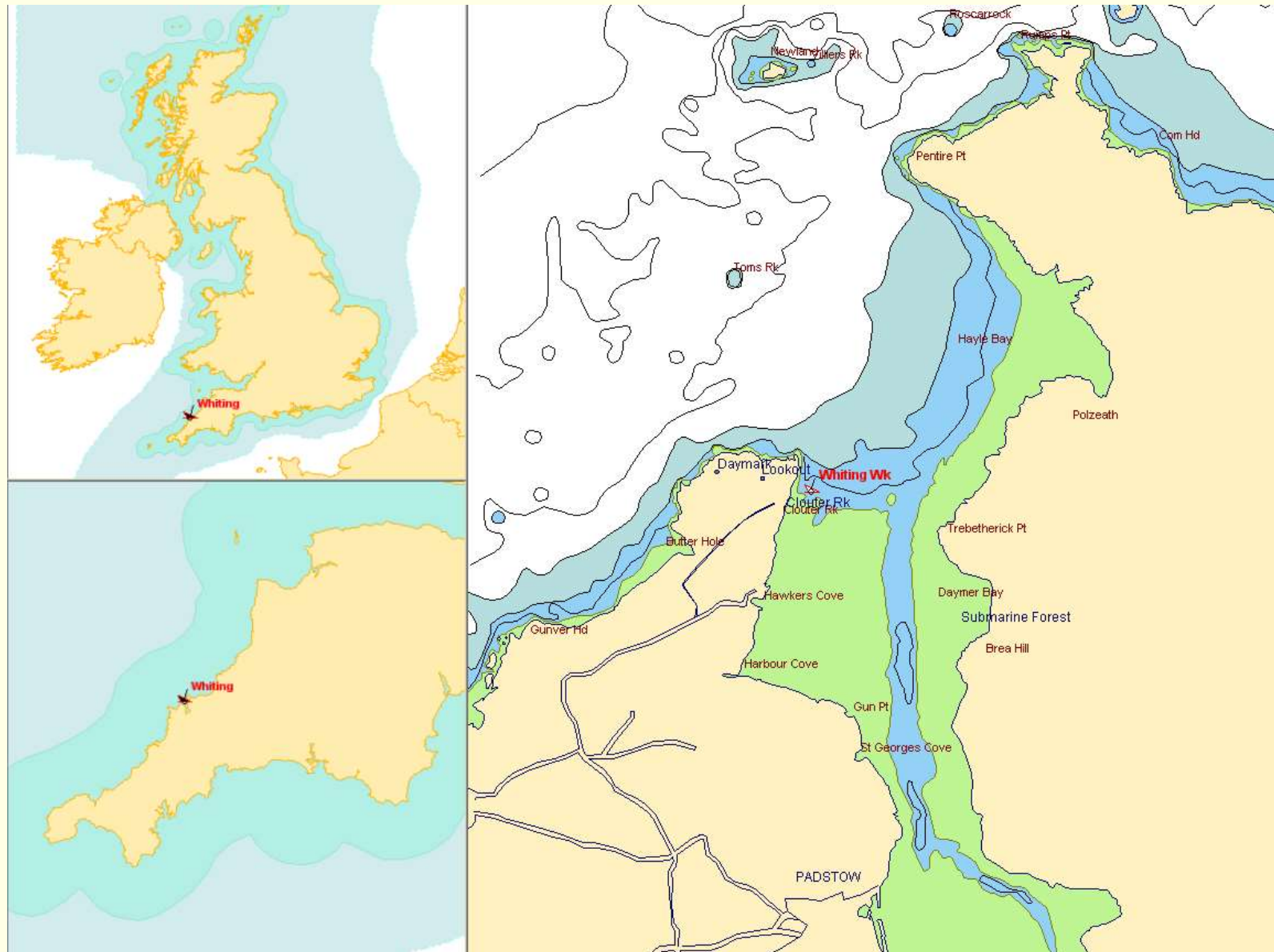


Lost 15 September 1816
on the Doom Bar, Padstow

*Wrecked 15th Sept 1816 on the Dunbar Sand.
A.O. 23 Oct 1816 directs that she shall be sold where she lies.*



Padstow and the Doom Bar





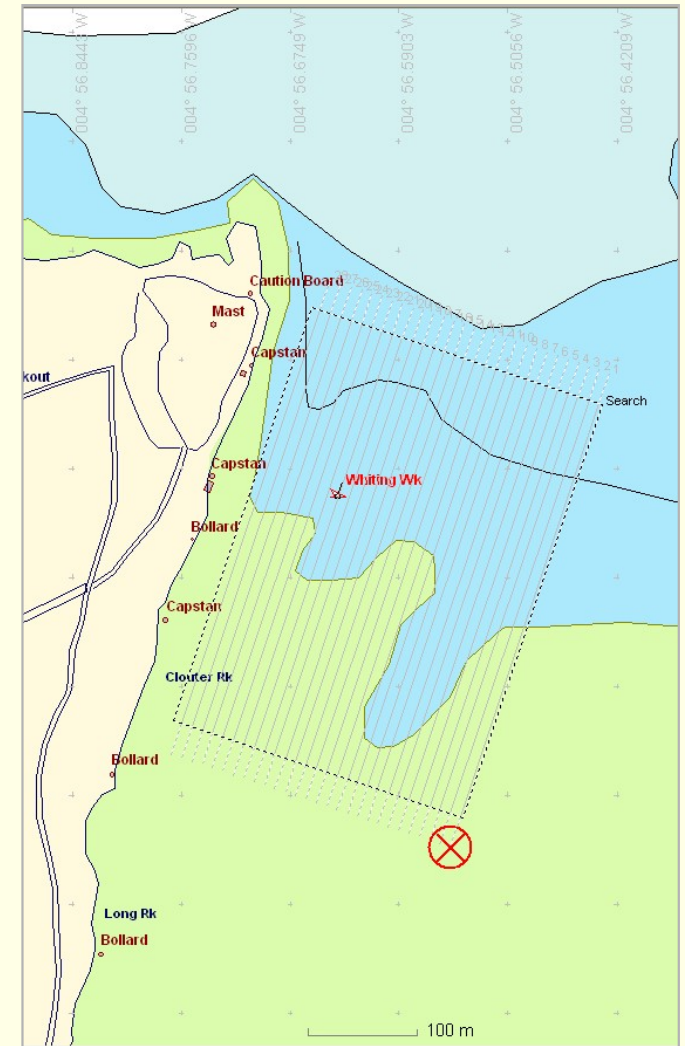
Padstow Harbour



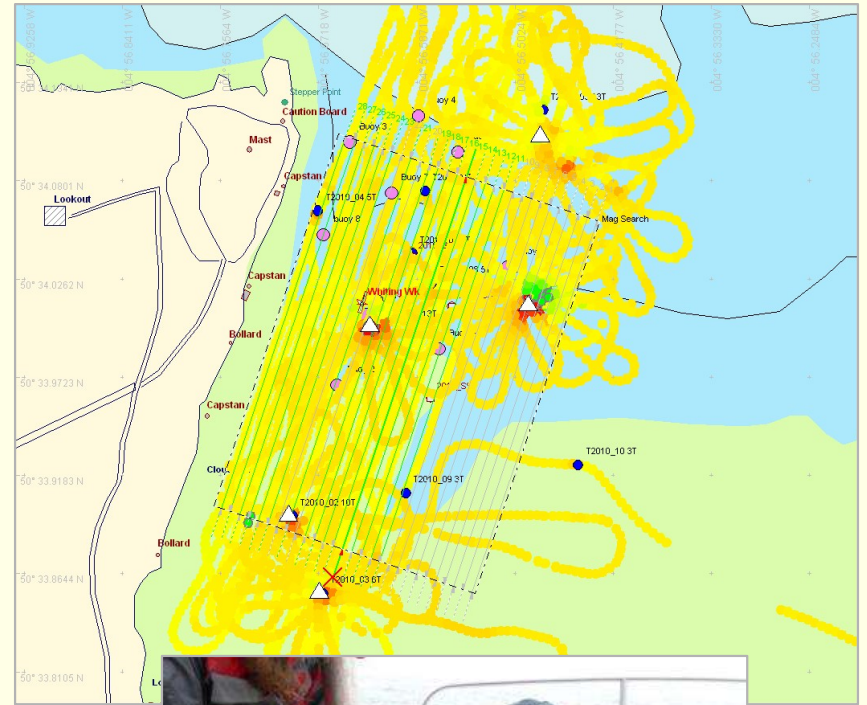
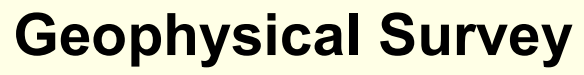

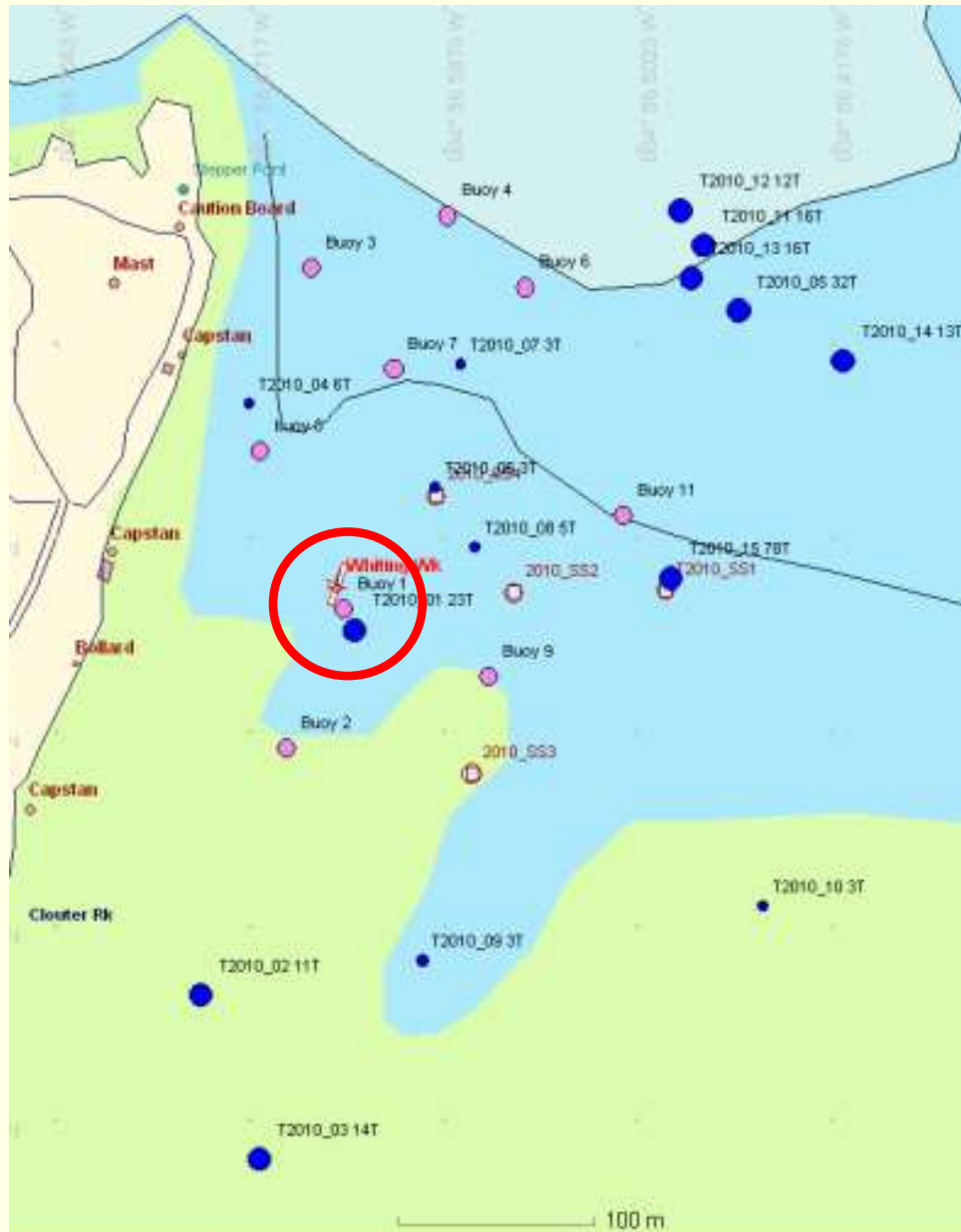


Padstow Harbour Association Lithograph (1829)

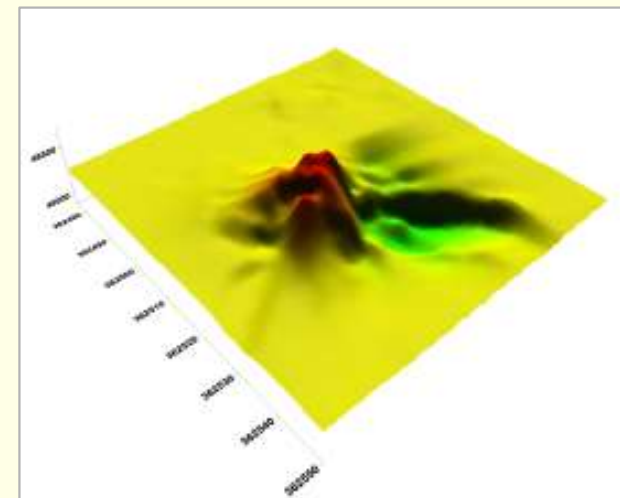
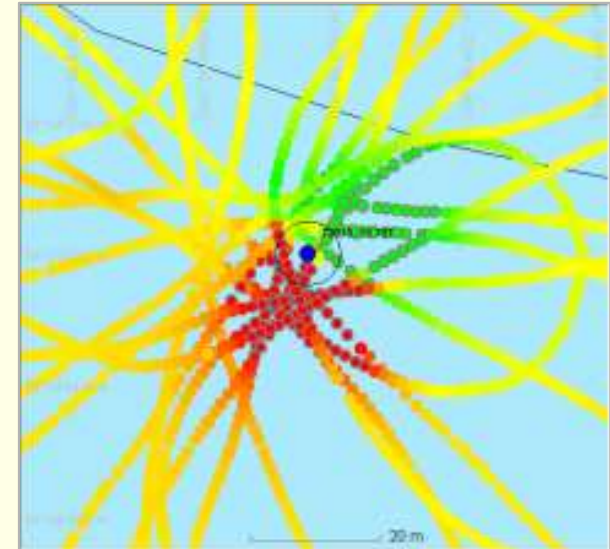
