







Baltimore Pilot Schooner *Arrow*

- Baltimore Pilot Schooner
- Built 1811
- Built at Fell's Point, Baltimore,
 by Thomas & Joseph Kemp
- Keel length 71ft (22m)
- Designed for speed and manoeuvrability
- With a 'sharp hull and extremely long spars'











From Arrow to HMS Whiting




- May 1812 Bordeaux for Baltimore
- Captured by HMS *Andromach*e (38 guns)
- Sent to Plymouth with a prize crew
- Taken up by the Royal Navy as HMS Whiting

the loft of the Majestys late thehooner whiting




Lost 15 September 1816 on the Doom Bar, Padstow

Padstow Harbour










Padstow Harbour Bathymetry










Padstow Harbour Association Lithograph (1829)
